ClinicalConnect and AGS Attestations

"Attestation" refers to the practice of periodically checking and certifying that only the individuals who need certain access privileges to ClinicalConnect and/or the Access Governance System (AGS) have those access privileges. Semi-annual attestations must be performed by various individuals at Participating Organizations; all DSA Signatories must attest that their organization's Privacy Officer and Local Registration Authorities still hold those roles, Privacy Officers must attest that their Privacy Auditors (if applicable) still hold that role, Sponsoring Physicians attest the staff they sponsor, and Local Registration Authorities attest their end users' access to ClinicalConnect. Attestation requests are sent out to these various individuals every May 1 and November 1, and must be completed in a timely manner to ensure access to ClinicalConnect and/or AGS remains in tact. We thank everyone who is required to perform attestations for completing this task. departments" Dr. Pardhan explains. "Especially after hours when this information could be extremely helpful but is hard to get, to have what I need at hand makes clinical decision making much easier, not to mention much more efficient."

Dr. Pardhan provided a few examples where ClinicalConnect provides significant value in the ED. "If a patient with a cardiac condition presents themselves in the ED in the middle of the night with uncontrolled bleeding, a physician would seek to determine if the bleeding could be INR-related. Using ClinicalConnect, we can check the patient's recent INR values, even if taken other regional hospitals or community labs, and then stop the bleeding associated with the injury more quickly. I can make the patient comfortable more quickly and with less time spent, and discomfort incurred, trying to ascertain the reason for the uncontrolled bleeding." In another example, Dr. Pardhan explains that a patient with respiratory issues, but who is from another part of south west Ontario, will present in the ED, can't speak, and is not a patient he has seen before, nor have they been treated at HHS. Dr. Pardhan would consider the possibility that the patient is suffering from COPD, check ClinicalConnect to see if a recent chest xray taken at another regional hospital is available and if so, view the image, to be able to determine the stage of the illness in order to treat the patient more effectively.

"With ClinicalConnect, we can provide more efficient and safe care to the undifferentiated patients who present to the ED" says Dr. Pardhan. Time and time again both physicians and clinicians are reporting that this intuitive, web-based portal has saved them from having to put patients through repeat testing that can result in discomfort and cost the healthcare system more than may really be required.
