## Grand River Hospital's new HIS Integrated with ClinicalConnect and Cardiology Module Update

The HITS eHealth Office at Hamilton Health Sciences, solution provider for ClinicalConnect, the regional clinical viewer for south west Ontario, is pleased to announce the successful integration of Grand River Hospital's new Health Information System, Cerner.

Users should note that the "Source" column to view data generated at GRH from September 22, 2019 onwards is now called "WW Hub", but does NOT include Pathology & Genetics, Cardiology, or Blood Bank data at this time.

Data, including Pathology & Genetics, Cardiology, and Blood Bank, generated prior to September 21, 2019 remains available in ClinicalConnect by selecting Grand River Hospital as the "Source".

Please note there is a second phase of this integration between ClinicalConnect and WW Hub's Cerner planned to go live in early November, which will include the integration of the remaining data being documented now in Cerner, plus all data from St. Mary's General Hospital which will share this instance of Cerner. Once complete, GRH and St. Mary's General Hospital will appear as Facilities with "WW Hub" as the "Source".

In addition to this integration, Cardiology-related data from the following acute care hospitals now appears in ClinicalConnect's Cardiology module, moved from its previous location in either the Radiology and/or Transcriptions modules:

- Alexandra Marine & General Hospital
- Brant Community Healthcare System
- Cambridge Memorial Hospital
- Huron Perth Health Alliance
- Niagara Health
- Norfolk General Hospital

This adds to the cardiology-related data from Hamilton Health Sciences and London & area hospitals that is already available in ClinicalConnect's Cardiology Module. This type of data from all remaining acute care data contributors in south west Ontario and the Diagnostic Imaging Common Service (data repository) will remain viewable in ClinicalConnect's Radiology and/or Transcriptions module.
