Ability to Subscribe to Real-Time New Results Notifications Now Available

We are pleased to advise that authorized users provisioned with web-based access to ClinicalConnect can now subscribe to be notified, by email, when new results become available for their patients in the following modules of the portal:

- Blood Bank
- Cardiology
- Labs
- Microbiology
- Radiology
- Pathology
- Transcription

These real-time notifications may be useful in various healthcare settings, to make clinical workflows more efficient when you're otherwise waiting for hospital-based results, to make a clinical decision or provide follow-up care.

Changing Pharmacy Landscape Improves ClinicalConnect Value to Pharmacists

Due in large part to COVID-19, the pharmacy sector has experienced a shift in how they provide patient care. In speaking with Rami Safi, Professional Affairs Lead for the Hamilton & District Pharmacy Association, a number of changes were highlighted that have occurred over the past year, including:

- An increase in virtual care between primary care providers and their patients.
- The role of community pharmacies as a referral and triage point of care.
- ePrescribing enrollments by primary care providers has increased.
- Centralized prescription filling (in some of the larger corporate and banner pharmacies) has also increased.

All of these have enabled an increase in the ability to provide expanded clinical services, such as medication reviews, pharmacogenomics services, and specialty medications (e.g., biologics). With

these changes, the value of ClinicalConnect increases significantly for the pharmacists.

With this shift in mind our ClinicalConnect Onboarding & Support team will be proactively engaging the pharmacy community during the next quarter to ensure they are aware of ClinicalConnect, and support them through the onboarding process where requested.

SickKids Data Available Through Acute & Community Clinical Data Repository (acCDR)

With increasing eligibility amongst ClinicalConnect Participant Organizations, including Sole (Physician) Practitioners to access the provincial repositories, we want to highlight some of the valuable data that's available in the portal in relation to providing healthcare to children and youth.

Since August 2020, The Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids) has been contributing data to the Acute & Community Clinical Data Repository (acCDR). This has been a long standing gap for users within south west Ontario, where Pediatrics teams have had to use both Electronic Child Health Network (eCHN) and ClinicalConnect to piece together information about their patient. For those now accessing the provincial repositories through ClinicalConnect, they now have access to critical information like discharge summaries, consultation reports, emergency department reports, visit/encounter details, and patient demographics for encounters at SickKids.

While this same information has always been available to ClinicalConnect users from local hospitals, such as McMaster Children's Hospital (through Hamilton Health Sciences), as well as other provincial locations like Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO), having this data from the "largest centre dedicated to improving children's health in the country" (source: https://www.sickkids.ca) is significant.

Implementing ClinicalConnect Within Your OHT

As many Ontario Health Teams (OHT) are forming, one of their key strategic priorities is the implementation of digital health tools to ensure an integrated health care system, to connect health care providers and services focused on the patient. One of the elements detailed in the OHT Digital Health Playbook is an overview of the digital health solutions available to OHTs.

An important digital health tool identified is ClinicalConnect, one of two provincial clinical viewers, as it also enables access to the provincial data repositories. Specifically it states, "OHTs are asked to ensure that their providers have access to the relevant information available in these repositories either through use of the provincial clinical viewers (in most cases) or through direct integration with their Point of Care (POC) solutions (i.e. Electronic Medical Record (EMR) systems or Hospital Information Systems (HISs)). ... To support integrated care delivery, OHTs are advised to ensure that all relevant staff have access to one of the two provincial viewers [depending on where the organization is located], ClinicalConnect or ConnectingOntario and, to support improved workflow, should also ensure that they have access to the Health Report Manager for notifications (see Health Report Manager (HRM) and eNotification Service)." Through our discussions with OHTs, we've determined this level of detail can be easily overlooked,

so felt it was important to highlight as OHTs begin to refocus on developing their OHT digital health strategies.
